## From Deacon Seija

#### St. Luke's Mission Link

When I was younger and wondering what to do with my life, I felt God telling me that He has never cancelled the Great Commission to go and make disciples for Him from all the nations in the world. This seemed to mean that I should either help to send workers in God's kingdom work or maybe offer myself if God would prefer that.

God's plan in my life unfolded by being sent abroad by His grace - first to Bangkok, then to Marseille and then to Leeds Universities Chaplaincy - meeting the international students from all over the world and sharing the Good News about Jesus in the Bible study groups. Bishop Emeritus Walter started the Lutheran presence in Leeds University decades before I arrived in this country and then asked me to continue the student work there. Finally I have been serving in York St John University send by St Luke's Lutheran church; meeting the international students there in English conversation group and Bible study groups.

This autumn God has been opening up a new horizon to continue St. Luke's mission work over in Marseille, France. I'm leaving on 5th September to conduct a survey among the international students finding out if we could start similar types of groups over there as we have in Leeds and in York. In addition to meeting with students I'll be visiting different churches to find out if we can find volunteers to meet the international students in Marseille in a 'club-cafe' set up.

When Jesus met with His first disciples he said to them: "Come, follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." (Mt 4.19) As God's Great Commission to go and make disciples for Him from all nations in the world has not been cancelled, it is our responsibility and privilege to take part in God's mission with St Luke's congregation. It is very exciting to see what God will do in Marseille through our small part in this co-operation. I hope and pray that we could already this year have our first international student Christmas celebration in Marseille!

When Dr. John joined the group a few months ago we had an increase of stimulating comments which very much enriched our discussions. She was pleased to be part of the group and thinks that through this kind of Bible discussion circle the Bible actually

opens up in a new and informative way through the input of other people. It challenged her and made her think about the topics and discussion later on at home. **So welcome everyone!**

As you are aware Pastor Mark has been involved with God's Squad Christian Motorcycle Club, a missions work very much concerned with the fringes of society.
